WHAT DISTINGUISHES THE VMOF FROM THE NUMEROUS HOSPITAL-BASED FOUNDATIONS

Few hospital-based foundations provide funding for out-of-hospital community based ambulatory
Foundations involved with breast cancer care projects.

VMOF's priority is to specifically support best ambulatory detection, treatment planning, and survivorship by helping to resolve the major delays that have unfortunately become the norm.







The VMOF Pilot Project

Accelerated Access to a Definitive Diagnosis (AADD)

THE VMOF WILL INITIATE A PROJECT TO PROMOTE ACCELERATED ACCESS TO A DEFINITIVE DIAGNOSIS (AADD)

The VMOF will thus explore using Foundation funding to resolve unacceptable delays in access to a definitive diagnosis, a required first step to then have access to a management plan for Breast Cancer patients in the public system.

The breast cancer literature has proven that the most stressful period of the breast cancer experience is between the first hint of a possible abnormality and the result of the biopsy required to establish a definitive diagnosis.







Proposed Solution

Accelerated Access to a Definitive Diagnosis (AADD)

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This pilot project requires close collaboration between a multidisciplinary team of experts, preferably at the same location, assisted by a team of Oncology navigators and with quick access to a complete imaging platform:

mammography, ultrasound, CT, MRI, PET, ultrasound-guided biopsy, stereotaxis.





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VMOF PILOT PROJECT PROTOCOL:

The AADD oncology navigation staff will confirm that an appropriate search was unable to provide the referred public patient with a reasonable confirmed access to the required exam(s) in the public system within a reasonable time.

As defined by the VMOC navigator, or any other VMOF-designated Centre.

 The AADD Oncology navigation team will ensure that the patient is genuinely unable to cope with a delayed diagnosis.

In the interim, the patient is kept on a public waiting list so as to not miss any reasonable unexpected openings leading to misuse of any VMOF funds

 The AADD pilot project oncology navigation team must confirm that the patient referred to the AADD project can not fund an ultrasound and / or biopsy within the private system.



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Every aspect the AADD Pilot
Project will be overseen, modified
as needed, documented and
managed under the auspices of the
VMOF Board, in collaboration with
the VMOF's medical and scientific
advisors.
